The Public Protection Classification (PPC) rating for our local Fire Department, EMS District #100, was changed to a 2 by the Texas Department of Insurance. The change is due to recent improvements made by our Community Volunteer Fire Department.

This new rating could mean a savings on insurance rates for property owners.

There is no law that requires an insurance carrier to factor in the PPC Rating when determining a rate for a property owner. A call to your current insurance carrier before making the decision to renew your current policy is recommended.

Basic Sugar Cookie Recipe

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1-1/2 tsp vanilla
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1-1/4 tsp baking powder
- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix together the flour and baking powder, and set aside.

- 3. In a large bowl, mix together butter and sugar until light and creamy. Beat in egg and vanilla.
- 4. Gradually add in flour and baking powder mixture until stiff.
- 5. Roll out dough about 1/4 inch thick and use cookie cutters to cut out desired shapes.
- 6. Place on prepared ungreased cookie sheets and bake for 7-8 minutes or until

edges turn a golden brown.

Makes about 2 dozen

Use a cookie cutter to form them into Christmas trees, angels, or other holiday shapes, add some green and red sprinkles, and you're ready to serve up a special treat for friends and family that is sure to become a holiday tradition.
